



Dear Parishioners of St. Agnes,

We are all painfully aware of the situation we have found ourselves dealing with. We have a duty to look out for each other as the family of God and as a parish family. The school has begun the process of educating the students at home until this passes. Our first priority is to feed people who need to be fed. The food pantry will be a vital link for us here to make sure basic needs are taken care of for the people.

The food pantry is open Mondays from Noon – 2PM and 5PM – 6:30PM. Contact the parish office for assistance 262-781-9521.

The office hours will be 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM Monday - Thursday. Please conduct your business over the phone so as not to put yourself or office personnel at risk.

The Church will be open from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM Monday - Thursday. Please bring sanitizer to keep the pew you sat in and yourself safe for the next person. We will do our best to clean the church as necessary.

On Sundays, the Church will be open for personal prayer from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM. At this time, you will be able to pray. You can watch the Mass on [Heart of the Nation](#) from the Seminary or the Mass is broadcast on WVTM My24 at 7 AM and 9 AM on channel 24 Sunday morning or WITI Fox 6 at 5:30 AM on Sunday. Unfortunately, the situation seems to change hourly. That is why it will be necessary to inform of any daily changes via the website.

The April 1st day of confession at St. Dominic's has been cancelled.

If you desire confession or anointing, please call and schedule. You may drive up and I will come to the parking lot and do this from your car so we remain at distance. Please keep in touch with each other via the phone and the internet as we need to see each other thru this crisis. The next parish event will most likely be handing out of palms on Palm Sunday, but we will do that on a drive up basis. Please wait for that announcement.

All nursing homes and assisted living homes have no contact allowed from the outside, and hospitals have a no visitor policy. I do not want to get anyone sick, nor become infected myself.

Keep the food pantry in mind in these times. The lobby will be open for donations during the week.

The parish finances are strained. If you have not lost your job, please continue to give so we can remain afloat during this time. This could not have come at a worse time as we must replace (unexpectedly) the heating units on the gym roof for approximately \$50,000 of unbudgeted expense.

There will be much more news ahead, both good and bad. Remember, we are one day closer to health than we were yesterday. With our hope in the resurrection, we set our sights on Jesus for it is God

who calls us to be brothers and sisters to each other. Many people have problems and we are all the solution as brothers and sisters. Let us look out and be Jesus for others.
